→ The NB need only to check that its name is clearly identified with the PPE for which it have carrying out the conformity assessment. NB will not check the accuracy of information relating to PPE for which it has not been commissioned.

- The NB must ensure that the risks covered by the use of the PPE for which it have carrying out the conformity assessment are clearly identified in the PPE. Mention of a series of generic risks covered by the same standard but not necessarily applicable to the product does not identify its intended use, nor does it provide an understanding of the limits of use actually applicable to the

- Documented instructions for use are needed for products. As such there must be a link, either by reproducing all product references, a family reference, or a code reproduced on the product and universal instruction.
- → The instructions must be linked to the product, and that the sections applicable to the PPE are clearly identified.
